The risk of slips trips or falls within the snowbox is high due to the nature of the extreme sports being partaken on a slippery surface.

All participants on snow activities will be given their footwear (ski/snowboard or snowplay boots) as well as any equipment needed.

All lessons that have been booked will have a qualified instructor for the discipline booked.

Helmets and gloves are compulsory for everyone taking part in a lesson, non-skilled activity or on a recreational lift pass.

All lessons are taken by BASI (or equivalent) qualified instructors.

All guests in a group on lift passes will be asked to provide details of shoe sizes, height and weight in advance to The Snow Centre to allow skis/ DIN settings to be set up. This speeds up the process for when you arrive on site and keeps skiers safe. They will be made aware of our recreational standard prior to purchasing lift passes.

Our recreational lift pass standard is you must be able to control their speed and direction, link turns and stop when necessary, use a button lift competently without assistance.
